

What to do in case of emergency?

Information for the public acc. to §11 Absatz 1 Störfallverordnung



Dear neighbours at Uerdingen,

Alberdingk Boley is taking care of environment and health. Safety is our first priority and although, we are doing our very best to protect from hazard, we cannot exclude incidents. Here you find our recommendation how to behave in case of emergency.

Take care!

How to behave in case of an incident

Safety Alert

- By sirene: 1 minute up and down
- By radio (Welle Niederrhein)
- By public calls
- By police and brigade vehicles
- Via NINA "Information-App (free of charge via iTunes or Google Play Store)

How do they inform about situation under control?

• There is an all clear-signal: 1 minute continuous tone by sirene

How can I recognise danger?

- · By visible signs such as fire and smoke
- By smell
- By reactions of your body such as nausea and eye-irritation

What do I have to do first?

- 1. Seek out closed rooms, these provide effective protection against gases and the threat of explosions for the time being.
- 2. Close all doors and windows and turn off 5. Take in fellow citizens seeking help. ventilation and air conditioning. Take this into account even if you are driving in a car
- 3. Do not take the children out of school or kindergarten.
- 4. Notify neighbours, children and passersby by calling out.

What do I do afterwards?

- 1. Do not do anything on your own! Wait for news and information from the responsible authorities!
- 2. Turn on the radio, the TV (regional programme) or the internet:
- 3. Radio: Welle Niederrhein:
 - 87,7 MHz (Funk)
 - 92,25 MHz (Kabel)
- 4. TV: regional programme
- 5. Internet: www.krefeld.de
- 6. Telephone: 02151 19700 (Citizens' information of the city of Krefeld)

Is there anything else I can do?

- 1. Go to an upper floor in case of unfamiliar 1. smells, as gases are usually heavier than air and remain on the ground. 2. avoid open fire (smoking!) because of the risk of explosion.
- Avoid open fire (smoking!) because of the danger of explosion
 - 2. If you notice a smell, hold wet cloths over your mouth and nose so as not to inhale any toxic substances.
 - 3. Welcome fellow citizens seeking help.

What should I not do?

- 1. Do not use the telephone or mobile phone except for emergency calls so as not to block the networks! They are needed for the emergency services
- 2. Do not leave the house without being asked and do not flee on foot or by car. You will endanger yourself. The traffic routes are urgently needed by the emergency services.
